

News from Your Local Gaelic Athletic Association

The Cleveland St. Pat's – St. Jarlath's Gaelic Athletic Association is wrapping up a fairy tale season in 2021. No one knew what to expect coming out of a COVID winter, but the executive board was confident in the membership and the recruitment efforts. With that, the club grew to fielding three adult teams for the Midwest Season – Men's Football, Ladies' Football, and Hurling. It all started for the footballers in early April with twice a week practice at the WSIA for the men, and once a week for the ladies. The spring efforts culminated in the Cleveland Memorial 7-A-Side Tournament at the Club on May 8th, this year in honor of Seán Gannon Snr. The Cleveland Men were equally split into two teams, and both progressed into the playoffs playing competitive football. Meanwhile the Ladies split the team equally *freisin* and were the talk of the tourney, playing each other in the semifinals and supplementing the eventual champions. It was a great tournament, led by Jim Coyne, coming out of a shutdown GAA season of 2020 with teams traveling in from Buffalo, Chicago, Cincinnati, Detroit, Indianapolis, and Pittsburgh to our WSIA. At the same time the footballers were working, Damon Margida and the hurling team were busy recruiting and training many brand new, energetic players to the GAA. In June the games began. Cleveland hosted Buffalo on the 5th and won soundly. The following weekend, the hurlers played their first, full-sided, official match against Akron at the Club, but fell to the more experienced side. The next Cleveland hosting would not be until July 17 when the Ladies and Men played Pittsburgh. Both Cleveland teams were competitive against the higher-grade Celtics and Banshees. A good crowd joined behind Cleveland GAA's official trad-band, Full 90, in the pub after the competition – bitter enemies on the field and *compánaigh* off of it. The Midwest Finals were held in Pittsburgh this year and the Cleveland Saints made the historical bid to send three teams to nationals after the play-in weekend: the Men would represent at Junior C, the Ladies at Junior C, and the Hurlers at Junior D. After a flurry of fundraising by the GAA alumni and coordination of logistics by club Vice-Chair, Maura English, the Club landed in Boston ready to play. Play they did on the weekend of August 20-22. The Men were first up, battled a perennial powerhouse, Charlotte GAA, but fell early Friday morning. The Ladies would go on to win their first USGAA Finals game on Friday holding Raleigh to zero points scored. On Saturday they fought, but fell against eventual championship winners, Delco Gaels. Lastly, in their inaugural season, winning their first bid to nationals, the hurlers beat two New Jersey clubs, Friday and Saturday, to land in the USGAA finals on Sunday against the James Connelly's of Charlotte. The Saints played hard until the final whistle, but gave away too many frees to win a championship game. All the teams will be back – USGAA finals 2022 are in Chicago and the momentum is contagious. After August, our Gaelic games were not finished. The hurlers held a city series competition amongst its members playing each Sunday morning at the Club in September. New members joined and the current player prepared for the Al O'Leary tournament held in Akron. On October 2, the Cleveland hurlers divided into 3 teams (most of any club present) and battled their way into the semifinals and finals. The trophy that weekend would be lifted by the Pittsburgh Pucas. In the end, it was some celebration in the Abby Room on October 23 for the Cleveland GAA Banquet: hosted renowned pre-season 7-a-side tournament; sent three teams to USGAA finals; the Ladies not only won their first bid at the USGAA Finals, but won their first game (5-12 to 0-0), fielded the first hurling team in decades and competed to a USGAA final! There are a lot of clubs that wished they had what Cleveland has: a hardworking executive board, enthusiastic membership and supporters, and outstanding facilities. By the end of the season, the adults had compiled 63 training sessions (Men = 31 on Tuesdays and Thursday, Ladies = 29 on Wednesdays and Fridays shifting Mondays and Wednesdays mid-year, and Hurlers = 3 on Sundays) at our WSIA field – known throughout the Midwest as *Pairc na Naomh* (Field of Saints). Combined with the youth program that held 8 sessions of football and hurling from June through August, the GAA was active at the WSIA Club the majority of nights during the spring and summer. With that it must be said to the volunteers, go raibh míle maith agaibh. The Cleveland GAA worked diligently along side man of our union friends to build the facilities we have. Our resources from the Night at the Races (a very successful joint venture with the WSIA) go into new topsoil and seed, irrigation, and fertilization of the pitch. The IBEW Local 38 (M³) along with donations from LIUNA Local 860 and GAA purchases made possible the installation the Gaelic field's backnets. We now have young men and women training on their own at the WSIA any given evening of the offseason because of the nets. But, there is no laurel-resting time here. We are already preparing for next year's Memorial 7's with the Pipefitters Local 120 improving our side-nets (good on yah Gallagher, McGowan, Somerville and Frank-honorary) and indoor trainings planned for January. The Cleveland GAA are proud members of the WSIA and promoters of Irish Culture through Our Games and Language. We welcome any new members, families, players, and supporters. Thanks to everyone for the support. We are active and growing and plan to continue our involvement at the WSIA!


