WORD HAS IT.... From Your Library

The End of the Strolling Players by Agnes Sullivan. This book is not available at this time in our library, but can be purchased online. This review is about the Golden Age of Travelling Shows in Ireland. It is specifically about the McCormack Family, which goes back over 300 years. Agnes Sullivan grew up in a traveling show and traveled all of Ireland. She faithfully recorded in her diaries her years traveling and performing. The stories contained in her writings will be consigned to history. Agnes clearly recorded details about how the family traveled from county to county, town to town providing in many cases the only entertainment to which the village might have access. The children attended the school of the village when they arrived, sometimes for only two or three days before moving on. In the evening the children performed in the family show. This writer learned so much from this little book. I learned the strolling players devoted their whole selves, the family, their lives to the business of performing. They raised well rounded children who respected their parents and the business. They were respected and welcomed in the villages.

This is the story of a dying tradition written by a lifetime performer, wife and mother, who taught her children the value of the arts, to appreciate what they have in life. This book was written over many years. She wrote many poems, short stories, editorials for publications. She quit writing on the death of her son, Tony, never seeing the book published. Agnes, had 7 brothers and 1 sister. Their home was a horse drawn wagon with lovely interiors, fitted out with solid mahogany or walnut furniture. The children were born and raised in these wagons. The McCormack's wagon was purchased by Agnes' father in the early 1920's. It was a showman's wagon with cut glass windows. They came into a town with their horse drawn wagon, found a field in which to park it. The cost could be high due to the horses, about ten shillings per animal per week. They operated a variety show in a canvas tent, consisting of singing, dancing, novelty acts, short sketches, magic, jokes and a drama as well. The father was an exceptional musician, all the brothers were talented as well, providing a band for the show. Agnes made her debut in 1937 singing "Did Your Mother Come From Ireland". The McCormack Family was the first to bring talking pictures to Counties Donegal, Mayo, and Kerry. Her diary reveals the hard times in the thirties and forties, how the people in the country were always happy to see them, sharing what they could in the way of vegetables and other foods they provided from the land. She writes of the Spanish War and World War II. She describes their life as they go from horses and wagons to a motorized family. A two-ton Ford truck was purchased to move all their equipment and pull the wagons.

Special Note: A descendant of the family, Derek McCormack was a lead singer with the group "The Barleycorn", well known on Irish Television. John Delaney was a member of the group also. Derek visited Cleveland, performing with John and Alec, "The New Barleycorn" here in Cleveland. Derek's mother, Emily, was a sister of Agnes' father.

That in 1958 the WSIA held the "burning of the mortgage" for the old IA Club building at 9613 Madison Avenue in Cleveland?

In 1972 the WSIA board decided to purchase 28 acres of land in Olmsted Township, with the dream of expansion, from Canary Realty Company.

In 1978, the WSIA purchased the Medina grounds for recreational activities and in 1981 they gathered again for another "burning of the Medina mortgage."

In 1983, the dream came together. Helen Malloy was elected the first woman president of the IA and with the construction committee of Terry Joyce, Sr., Eddie Campbell, Kathleen McNeeley and Fred Kelly (project supervisor), along with the support of the IA Board, the membership and the countless, talented skilled tradesmen and laborers, and also the countless IA members who all stepped up and volunteered to come together and build our current beautiful facilities in Olmsted Township. The grand opening was held in 1990.

"And now you know the rest of the story!"

We would like to recognize and thank the John E. Gallagher, Sr. family for their generosity in donating the cost and installation of the waterfall. The John and Catherine (nee Dever) Gallagher family has been very generous to the West Side IA for many years and to so many other organizations throughout Greater Cleveland and beyond.

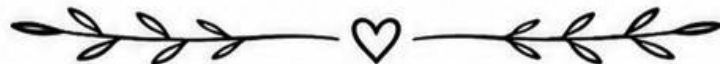
